Part 2: Process improvements in endoscope reprocessing: simpler - safer - faster – more cost-effective

Automated reprocessing with WD (washer disinfectants) has become standard practice. This part of the workshop works out what has to be taken into account to make reprocessing procedures more hygienic – simpler, faster and cheaper.

There are numerous innovations and process optimisations available:

- **Simpler:** There are numerous approaches which make the process simple, e.g. documentation.
- **Safer:** technical solutions for enhanced safety in automated endoscope reprocessing.
- **Faster:** often endoscopists must wait for endoscopes. Find out how you can speed up the process incl. drying.
- **Low cost:** The cost of reprocessing is high - especially concerning consumption of chemicals, consequential costs, damaged endoscopes and endoscope purchases. The workshop works out which possibilities are available to save costs
