National societies, groups or federations which represent the interests of gastroenterology and endoscopy nurses and endoscopy associates based in a Non-European country

Benefits of the ESGENA Passive Group Membership

Communication & Information

- Access to the ESGENA membership area with a national access code
- Listing in ESGENA Member Society directory
- Announcement of Society meetings on the ESGENA website and at ESGENA booths during ESGENA Conferences
- ESGENA E-NEWS (6x per year): National groups have the responsibility to distribute the ESGENA E-NEWS to its members
- Regular updates: ESGENA group members are regularly updated on ESGENA activities, on-going guidelines, statements and curricula.

Education

- National members of the ESGENA group members have access to the ESGENA clinical grant programme

ESGENA Annual General Assembly

- National members of the ESGENA group members have access to the ESGENA Annual General Assembly with the right to
 - submit topics for the agenda
 - attend and to speak at the Annual General Assembly
 - stand for office if they are based in a European country (see definitions below)

ESGENA Membership Application and Fees

In order for a society to become a member,

- The annual fee for ESGENA Group Membership depends on the number of members (see table below)
- An official invoice will be issued.
- Please complete the online application form and submit it as directed.

- You will immediately receive an automated confirmation of receipt. After ESGENA Governing Board approval you will receive an official welcome letter including your membership ID.
- Groups which have more than 100 members should pay by bank transfer ONLY (no cash, no payment by cheque).

Albania, Andorra, Armenia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Kazakhstan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Republic of Macedonia, Malta, Moldova, Monaco, Montenegro, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, San Marino, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom, Vatican City.

This geographical division does not imply any assumption regarding political or other affiliations of countries, e.g. membership in the EU.
