New in 2026: Safe Sedation Course

We are excited to offer this new course focused on endoscopic procedural sedation. Under the direction of Professor Stefano Romagnoli, Head of the Department of Anaesthesia and Critical Care at Careggi Hospital in Florence, Italy, this course will offer a limited number of participants the opportunity to dive deep into critical aspects of sedation in the clinical setting. Theory: The first session will be held on Wednesday, May 13, 2026, from 12:30 – 19:00, prior to the core ESGE Days 2025 event (Thursday, May 14 - Saturday, May 16). It will feature theory and practical demonstrations on the following topics:

- Pre-endoscopy assessment and evaluation
- Patient monitoring and equipment
- Analgesic and sedative agents

- Adverse events and rescue, basic airway interventions

The second part of the course will be a 1,5 hour hands-on training session on Real-life Patient-Simulators during the core event. These sessions will involve practical training on the AQAI sedation model which allows for simulation of real-life sedation scenarios. A maximum of 8 participants will be allocated to each session ensuring that all participants have adequate time to perform tasks on the simulator.
